

Louise Spring Memorial

With the passing of Mrs. Louise Spring in April of 2017 came the donation of memorial funds to the library from many individuals who knew her as a Kindergarten teacher, library Board member, library volunteer, Albany resident, active community member, friend, mother, grandmother, and great-grandmother.

These funds will purchase a new oversized board book bin and Eric Carle carpet for our children's area, a large storytime carpet for children's programming, and a builtin shelving unit for our community room.

Additionally, the library will donate a minimum of 25 new picture books in her memory to both Kindergarten classrooms at Albany School, where Mrs. Spring's legacy will in part reside with the classrooms and age of students she served for so many years.

Mrs. Spring was appointed Secretary of the Joint Board of the Albany Public Library on February 1, 1978, and remained part of the Library Board until her resignation in 2016. Prior to that she assisted with children's programs and is credited with instituting library storytime.
